Rhonda Lowery Executive Director Report

- Youth- 4 proposals have been received however we could not except one of them as they did not meet the requirements. We have received more than 200 applicants for the summer intern program. The youth unit will also hire a one new employee.
- Contract renewal- contracts will go out as well as the ITA's. There will also be a pool of providers which will be on the portal on 4/18/19.
- GAINS- our submitted proposal has been accepted.
- AC Electric- 19 participants tested and those that has scored sufficiently will possibility be hired by AC Electric. Currently there is a great need for a Line School Instructor to further the required course.
- WFNJ- this unit will be hiring two case managers.
- Next GEN- this is a State contract and is an employer driven program. Businesses work together then will contact the State with the training needed to fill their current positions

Provider Updates

Ren Parikh Ideal Institute- is working well with the Atlantic City Chamber. We have also opened an Amazon store that the youth in our program run. Ideal also has a Virtual Reality Game Room which will open in the month of May 2019. This will also be operated by the youth which has obtained their GED.

Diana Streleczyk- WFNJ referrals are low of which we have concerns regarding the population that attends. Due to the low attendance and low referrals meeting the required level of service is challenging.

Maryann McGhee Americaworks- currently there are three participants employed and is striving to meet the required level of service.

Jim Waters FCD- is currently working with the One Stop Operator and the WFNJ unit Supervisor to ensure accuracy and participant flow.

Dasha Brown- has a van that transports participants to and from Walmart every 1st and 3rd week of the month.

Sherwood Taylor Atlantic Cape Community College- will host the AC Electric meeting for those participants that has past their testing and is moving forward to the phase of classes.
