Chairman Risley opened the public hearing for comments at 5:01 p.m.

Keith Moore, resident of Brigantine, supports the resolution but would like the Board to reconsider a moratorium.

Lori Goldsmid, resident of Brigantine, clarified the distance of the offshore wind turbines.

Dr. Philip Pepe, resident of Brigantine, urged the Board to vote no on a moratorium because of the benefits of the project.

Gary Wolf, resident of Northfield, supports the resolution because of the negative impacts on the fishing industry.

Rich Baehrle, resident of Northfield, is a fisherman who believes the negative effects of the windmills will be irreversible.

Tim Kriebel, Ventnor Commissioner, thanked the Board for the resolution to address the concerns of his coastal community constituents.

Creed Pogue, resident of Estell Manor, stated the County does not have the authority to do a moratorium on development.

Rhonda Delasandro, resident of Galloway, provided the specifications of the wind turbines and encouraged the Board to read the BOEM Environmental Impact Statement.

Dan Lawler, Longport Commissioner, supports the resolution along with Commissioner Leeds.

Anne Phillips, resident of Brigantine, thanked the Board for the resolution and urged the Board to use the law to defeat the project.

Virginia Houck, resident of Brigantine, urged everyone to read the Bureau of Ocean Energy Management (BOEM) report about the adverse effects of the project.

Eileen Barker, resident of Atlantic City, stated wind turbines are not green energy and shared a photo of a turbine.

Jerry Szucs, resident of Brigantine, appreciates the nonpartisan views but supports offshore wind development.

Gina Ackerman, resident of Linwood, requested the project be researched first to understand the impacts of offshore wind development.

Doug Crawford, resident of Ocean City, believes there are other alternatives for energy than industrializing the ocean.

Sunni Vargas, resident of Forked River, supports the development stating there are other explanations for the whale deaths.

Christine Mazzulo, resident of Brigantine, relayed that people do not know what is going on with this project and is concerned for the health of humans and animals.

John Kunterman, resident of Avalon, is fighting for marine life and supports the resolution.

Kathryn Finnegan, resident of Brigantine, thanked the Board for the resolution and encouraged the Board to consider their constituents.

Kim O’Brien, resident of Somers Point, stated the waters are warming and asked if the Board will accept the findings of the Governor’s Accountability Office.

Hector Tavaréz, resident of Egg Harbor Township, stated the resolution is political and the focus should be on facts.

Cyndi Pekarick, resident of Brigantine, does not know the cause of whale deaths and humans are polluting the air, land and now the ocean.

There being no further comments, the meeting was closed to the public at 6:03 p.m.
